Lessons On Faith Even In The Provision Of Manna And Quail

In the second month after leaving Egypt, at the Desert of Sin, more than two million Israelites faced a technically insurmountable food shortage problem. There, despite their grumbling, God graciously provided manna and quail. Indeed, "The will of God will not take us where the grace of God cannot sustain us" (Billy Graham). We can draw some lessons through the contrasting responses of Moses and the Israelites when tested.

Faith looks forward and presses on. Facing the possibility of starvation, the faithless Israelites murmured against Moses and Aaron. But that was grumbling against God, who is sovereign and holds the broad events and the details of our lives in his hands. They looked back to the days when they sat around pots of meat in Egypt. Despite dealing with a rebellious bunch, Moses remained focused on God's mission for him. True faith is forward looking. Looking back causes us to lose sight of God's future and purpose for us. The apostle Paul says "Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus" (Philippians 3:13b-14). Jesus says, "No one who puts a hand to the plow and looks back is fit for service in the kingdom of God" (Luke 9:62).

Faith acts. Faith is proven and strengthened when exercised. "A faith that hasn't been tested can't be trusted" (Adrian Rogers). God was working on the Israelites to grow them in their faith but they repeatedly failed to act by faith, so their faith did not take root. In contrast, their attitude brought out Moses' faith and confidence in God. From the time God called Moses at the burning bush, his faith continued to be strengthened as he responded by faith and in obedience to God each time.

Faith rests. Faith rests in the assurance of God's presence. Faith is not obeying without fear but obeying despite fear. God's presence had been with the Israelites as he led them through the pillar of cloud by day and the pillar of fire by night and he even heard their grumbling (Exodus 16:11). The glory of the LORD also appeared in the cloud when Aaron was speaking to the Israelite community (Exodus 16:10). Moses and Aaron rested in the assurance of God's presence and ever-present help. This is also evident through another later occasion in the wilderness, when Moses said to the LORD, "If your Presence does not go with us, do not send us up from here" (Exodus 33:15). Moses would not want to be where God's presence was not going to be with him and the Israelites.

Faith trusts. Faith trusts and takes God at his word. Moses and Aaron took God at his word and relayed God's promise of meat and bread to the Israelites. No "double confirmation" needed. And God provided manna and quail, graciously and unexpectedly. Faith trusts in God and his word.

God said he will rain down bread from heaven and test the Israelites to see whether they will follow his instructions (Exodus 16:4). Even through the provision of manna, the Israelites would be tested! This shows how God is intentional in growing our trust and faith. Daily, how aware are you that God wants to test you and grow you in your faith? Through small or big things, success or failure, through changes or daily humdrum, crisis or celebrations. Are you going about life like the Israelites who did not allow faith to take root and grow? Will you choose to be like Moses who grew from faith to faith because he was aware and acted in obedience?
